And according to The World Counts, from 2010-2060, global consumption is expected to double.

As such, the practice of gift wrapping has become a major area of concern for environmentalists because pulp and paper are the third largest industrial polluter of air, water, and soil.

In addition, the paper is often burnt at landfills, and contains toxic coloured inks that leak into soil and bodies of water, which in turn affect our water-table, wildlife, and natural environment.

As we know, the Christmas spirit isn't intentionally trying to harm the planet, but things quickly begin to add up when we don't recycle our wrapping paper and cardboard.

Our Christmas cards are not safe either since statistics show that over 150 million Christmas cards are thrown out in the UK alone.


