## Our 2022 Recycling Recap - Celebrating our 6-Million Kilogram Collection Year!

For most, 2022 was a year of new beginnings as citizens and businesses were once again able to experience some degree of normalcy with the relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions. As activity heightened, HADCO's Recycling Division experienced an increase in waste collections.

HADCO's Recycling Division, which comprises of New Age Recycling and Ecoimpact were no exception to the heightened activity, **clocking in over six million kilograms of collected waste material from all over Trinidad and Tobago**. All of this in addition to launching an end-of-life tyre facility means that it has been quite the year for us!

To put this achievement into perspective, six million kilograms roughly converts to 6,000 metric tonnes, just over 13 million pounds, or the combined weight of 3,250 cars!

Our suite of services provide complimentary waste collection as well as drop-off points for businesses, restaurants and citizens for the following materials: paper, cardboard, plastic, aluminium, PET, glass, waste cooking oil, batteries; and now end-of-life tyres, as we continue to reduce the amount of waste that end up in our landfills through responsible recycling.

# Breakdown of Waste Collection

The six million kilograms of waste collected is comprised of the following figures as reported by HADCO's Recycling Division after tallying their collection quantities for the year 2022.



## Wastepaper -

Most scrap and printer paper, newsprint, books, magazines, wax paper, etc.



## Cardboard -

Most cardboard boxes and packaging, snack boxes, soap boxes, and tissue roll cores, etc.



## Vegetable Cooking Oil -

Vegetable-based oils such as olive oil, palm oil, soybean oil, corn oil, and sunflower oil.



## Plastics (HDPE) -

Shampoo bottles, liquid soap and bleach bottles, plastic food and pint containers, etc.



## Glass -

Wine, beer bottles, food, sauce and jam jars, etc.



## Our 2022 Recyclable Collection Total -

Over six million kilograms of recyclable materials collected from Trinidad and Tobago
